EDITORS REPORT

Welcome to October, and a big welcome to the new TCC Office Bearers for 2018/19. Thank you to all of our previous office bearers, and those who have continued on, for their efforts over the past 12 months. Here's hoping that the next 12 months bring a great new year of motorsport for the club. There's already some work behind the scenes for some new events in 2019, so it should be a good year!!



Andrew and I will once again be sharing the Editorial role. Andrew's work is

as crazy as ever and as for myself, besides taking on the Social Secretary role last year, I have been putting my hand up to run more events in both 2018 and 2019 so have become even more busy! So we felt that this was the best way for us both to ensure that our commitments inside and outside of the club would still be met.

All of the Office Bearers for 2018/19 are in the inside cover of the magazine. So check out the list and make sure you thank them all for stepping up for TCC, especially those who hold multiple roles. You will also notice a number of vacancies. I really encourage you all to consider putting your hand up for one of these roles. In all seriousness, the roles that are vacant have some of the least amount of work required for the role. If you are concerned you don't know enough to do the role, then simply come and talk to one of us. Many of us have done the position before so can easily provide some advice, help and support to you as you settle into the role.

Do you turn up to most club meetings? Then maybe the Meeting Officer role is for you. The meeting officer organises the setting up of our meeting venue, currently Pennant Hills Learning & Leisure Centre, which involves putting out all the tables and chairs in readiness for each monthly meeting, setting up our TV which is held on site and providing tea and coffee at our monthly club meetings, which I believe Karen Yates has put her hand up to help with anyway. Although not absolutely essential, the Meeting Officer would preferably be the first to arrive, and the last to leave the premises. On top of this, it would be good if the Meeting Officer had access to a library of Motor Sport videos/DVDs to keep members entertained after the meeting, over a cup of tea or coffee.

Do you have very little spare time, but could give the club one day of your time over the entire year? Do you know how to count? Then maybe the Honorary Auditor position is for you. The Honorary Auditor role is, from time to time, to check financial issues which may be raised by the Treasurer. The Honorary Auditor also checks the annual financials of the club for presentation at the Annual General Meeting in September each year. This is not an Executive position.

The hardest position to fill, and somewhat understandably, is the Officials Registrar. Most people are scared of the word official and are scared of possibly having to deal with CAMS! Having done the position before, the role can be as big or as little as you make it. We already have a list of members and their officials licences thanks to the membership forms, so this part is already done and is updated each year. Ideally this person would also encourage members to upgrade their official's licences at our events. I would be more than willing to help this person with ways to encourage our members to upgrade their licences. This would help reduce the strain on a number of our main event running officials who also hold some of the most intense workload positions on the TCC Executive. CAMS are trying to make events easier by reducing the requirements for officials, but with a number of members who are forever trainee officials, this is making it harder to fill some of the easier positions.

With a supporter from each side managing to win each of the heats it was close competition, but Nick Tonitto and Dean Tomlin was first and second respectively in the Group A Final and Andrew Crowley won the Group B Final. At the end of the day HDCC finished on 312 points with TCC on 414, meaning that HDCC takes home the wooden spoon for a second year in a row! The twelve tests chosen for the event were Square Slalom, Pentagon, Forward and Reverse Slalom, Gables, Star, Hopkirk, Double Loop, Lazy Eight, Three Lanes, Try Angles, Plumb Crazy and Spiro Slalom. There were 54 starters out at Nirimba for the event with 3

TCC competitors being David Masing, Brett Manewell and Justin Chiew.

First outright has done it before, and she can certainly drive! Corrine East-Johnson in the Honda Special took out the event 2 seconds clear of second place, Aaron Wuillemin in a Special and third, almost 6 seconds behind, was Tony Wallis in another Special. Class A was won by Kelvin Goldfinch in his Moke and Class B was won by Michael (Fly) Heslewood in his camouflage Lancer. This was great work by Michael who hasn't competed for some time and even hit a flag early on in the day! Class C was won by David Masing in his blue Lancer. Apparently, he also had a monumental stuff up and lost 7 seconds to his nearest rival, but managed to get that time back plus more over the remaining tests. Class D was won by Reece McIntosh in his BMW M3 and Class E was won by Jeff Salmon in his Subaru STi. Class F was won by Corrine East-Johnson and Class G was won by Aaron Wuillemin. It was great to see that most of the winners were NSW competitors. In terms of outright for the TCC members, David finished 18th, Brett in his Mazda MX-5 finished 34th outright and Justin in a Ford Focus finished 38th outright. Sadly for the Colliers, it just wasn't their day. Between flags, stuck throttle, misfires and a broken axle, their day didn't go to plan and then as they were loading their Special noticed a possible cracked drive plate. Samantha finished 10th Outright, whilst Andrew finished 11th outright. With the NSW Motorkhana Championship finished for the year, and the AMC over, they now have time to get their Special ready for the 2019 championship!

There hasn't been too much going on in the WRC of late, well since Kris Meeke was removed mid-year after trying too hard and crashing a wee bit too much. There really hasn't been any news of who might be taking his place in Hyundai either. Sebastian Ogier is returning to Citroen next year after signing a 2 year contract with them. Apparently, one of the factors behind his decision was the desire to win the championship with a third team. The only other person that has done this was Juha Kankkunen. And with 5 consecutive word titles with Volkswagen Motorsport and M-Sport Ford, Sebastian is the WRC's second most successful driver behind his former Citroen team mate Sebastian Loeb.

With the Bathurst 1000 only a couple of days away, I have made sure that I am home and will be comfortable in front of the TV all day! Did you know that this is its 58th running of this event? This also sees the last year the Ford Falcon will run, with the return of the Mustang's in 2019. Lowndes obviously announced his retirement some months ago, but it appears that Red Bull will not be replacing him and will revert to a two car team in 2019 according to Roland Dane. I'm sure the event will also pay respect to Bob Jane who recently passed away after a long battle with cancer.

The World Time Attack will be at Sydney Motorsport Park on Friday 1th and Saturday 13th October. John Boston has again landed himself a ride. He is in the Link ECU Open Class as car 32, a part of the Xtreme GTR team driving a Nissan R32 GTR with Michele Guyer who owns the car. John has been helping with

some of the research and development with this car over the past couple of months and has been enjoying testing the car down at Wakefield Park. I believe they are quite happy with their early testing, especially as it was on old tyres This car had a serious engine bay fire last year and has been totally rebuilt to be stronger and faster. Adam Casmiri is also in this class running with team JDMyard / Hardrace in a Honda Civic - car 21. If you are there to watch the action, make sure you keep an eye on these cars!!

Dirt and Dust Rover Khanacross

On the long weekend at the end of September the Rover Scouts held the Dirt and Dust Rover Moot at the Sydney Off Road Racing Association (SORRA) grounds on the Colo Putty Road north of Windsor. A Rover Moot is a camp for Scouts aged 18 to 26 years old at which they have a number competitive activities during the day and then at night there is musical entertainment or a campfire around which stories can be swapped while enjoying a few beers or other alcoholic beverages.

The major activity for this Moot was an introduction to khanacross run by our TCC with Matt Rath and Alana Dean doing the directing and administration and I was doing the first aid and the scrutineering. Matt was able to use the dirt circuit and some of the tracks around the circuit that were not too cut up from the buggies that usually use these tracks. Ian, the caretaker, was able to fill and grade the tracks we were going to use to make it possible for normal road cars to run. Due to the drought the area was very dry and so the roads very dusty. Some of the longer tracks could not be used as they went through the camping area and where the other Moot activities were being run.

The Rovers in Victoria run an event know as MUD BASH which is like an obstacle course with lots of regulation on how the cars are prepared which can limit the other events the cars can be run. Brush Park Rover Crew brought their Nissan 200B car known as Black Betty to one of our motorkhanas. It was jacked up very high and handled very poorly. Eventually at one MUD BASH the car rolled six times and was a write off.

For this weekend eight cars ran including my Blue Hyundai Excel which I wanted to test out since I had only driven it at two Ernie's Revenge Motorkhanas since I bought it after it was rolled. We had a Holden Commodore, a Ford Falcon, a Suzuki Vitara, a Honda Prelude, a Toyota Corolla, a Mazda station wagon and a well prepared Holden Ute with sand bags in the back to make it handle. Some of these cars were too low for the sand on some parts of the tracks but great for the dirt circuit. They were all unregistered cheap cars with a few modifications such as retread winter tread tyres and open exhausts to make them sound fast. We had 18 drivers so there was lots of bragging rights between drivers and teams.

After the driver's briefing all officials and drivers had to be breath tested by the CAMS officials for zero alcohol limit to compete. The enthusiasm of the drivers meant we had a few spins and the occasional excursion into the bush. Then as the sand got deeper a few trees were hit causing some major panel work at the front and a few broken head lights. Matt's recovery service was required a few times to pull cars out of the bush. My first run was fair because I found the Excel very loose in the rear end under brakes. The second course used part of the dirt circuit and on the second corner I spun it under braking but did not hit the bank. Third course I stalled the engine at the turn around point trying to hand brake turn around the tree.

On Saturday we all had two runs in the afternoon, two runs on the dirt circuit at night and the same three courses on Sunday in the reverse direction in the afternoon and night. I was able to try out my LED light bar and the HID driving lights in the light pod that came with the car. The decision was the light bar goes on my Toyota road car and stay with the light pod on the Excel. As time went on I was able to use the braking problem to control the car when it understeered on the tighter corners. Braking into the stop garage at night like I would in my previous White Excel brought cheer from the crowd as I spun outside the garage or ended up sideways in the garage. After these two days of competition I have a list of things I need to improve or add to the car.

It was nice to see how the young drivers' skills improved over the two days and I am sure they all had great fun driving the courses. Matt and I are hoping some of the competitors will join



Thornleigh Car Club and continue to compete with their cars in motorkhanas and khanacross. Matt had lots of trophies for fastest individuals and best team results. The Vitara crew gained the top prize for the greatest damage to their vehicle when they ran straight into a tree but still finished the event. All cars could be driven onto their trailers at the end of the event. Thanks to Matt and Alana for running a great event over the two days of completion. Rule 1 "No beers until the driving was finished".

A few thoughts from October 2003 Look Back Well, Guess What? I did such a good job writing this stuff 15 years ago, that I've nothing to add!!

PISTON SLAP - OCTOBER, 2003.

LOOK BACK.

A Nostalgic roam through past 'Piston Slaps' for the month of October.

<u> 1978:</u>

Phil Coffey replaced Don Adams as Editor, he thanked Don for his efforts and reminded members that the club was entering its 25th year and pleaded for articles for 'Piston Slap'. The new President, Ken McCraw, was apparently stunned by his election, as he wrote nothing for the magazine. The late A.A.R of the T.C.C. (Alan Ridley) wrote an article entitled 'Nostalgia Ain't What it Used to Be' and dealt with his views on modern cars and a report on the Progressive Dinner that had just been held. Events for the month were The President's Touring Assembly and an Amaroo Hill Climb. The Touring Assembly was directed by past President, John Radford and turned out to be an Economy Run. Gary & Wendy Maher won the event in a Nissan 3-ton truck with petrol engine. It got 41 miles per gallon but BIG ton miles per gallon. John Littler was next in a VW Combi Camper with 54.7 mpg. Best sedan was Don Adams in a Renault 12 with 61mpg but he went down on ton miles too. FTD at the Hill Climb was Mark Wallis in a Formula Vee with 24.57; then Don Adams in a Mini Cooper S – 27.08; Ernie Boston 28.72; Steve Lansley 29.25 and Phil Coffey with 29.52 – all in Geminis.

<u> 1983:</u>

The Executive didn't change much this year but Editor Steve Lansley and President Gary Maher went on to thank past officers for their services and entrusted the club into the hands of the 'new lot'. Events were an Amaroo Park Circuit – no results and not even a report in 'Bits From Boston'. There was also a 50km Rally at Lowes Mountain, near Oberon. TCC had 6 starters in the 38 – car field. Our best performers were Ken Barnwell & Greg Yates in Ken's Datsun 1600 – 5TH Outright. 24th Outright was Gary Maher with Number One son, Andrew, navigating in the Bellett. The Mahers beat Phil Coffey and Steve Lansley because Steve got a WD at the end of a section. I mention this because it was Andrew's first attempt at navigating – he was only 13 years old! It must have been the time of the year for Progressive Dinners in the past years because we had yet another one in October 1983 – also well attended and well received.

<u>1988:</u>

The new Editor, Steve Bicket, started his year with the usual plea for more articles for the magazine. Phil Coffey, who was still President, congratulated Garry Elliott for winning his class in the Australian National Motorkhana Championship. Only three crews went to Canberra for the 'Wello Rally' that year, being Kirk Marks and Michael Rourke in the ex-Barnwell 1600; Garry Elliott and Ray Rowe in the Subaru and Gary Maher and Jim Richardson in the Lancer. Gary Maher wrote his usual long-winded article pointing out the highlights of the event. These included such thing like Michael Rourke's Irish joke telling, Kirk Marks tour of the Australian Institute of Sport, afternoon tea in the members' dining room of the then (new) Parliament House and John Little and Ian Maher, our service crew, having hot towels for us at the service break. The event was run in near freezing conditions and at 9.00pm we heard that it was only 1°. The event was well organized and the 33 starters enjoyed the legendary ACT forest roads. Kirk was placed 5th, Garry E 13th and Gary M 15th. We all drove home after the event and Jim and Gary M arrived home at 4.30am. My god! What stamina we had in those days! Wendy Maher directed and Janelle Lansley was Secretary at our Amaroo Dirt Circuit at the end of the month. The event attracted 49 starters. The circuit was in great shape, having just been re-graded and the weather was good. Everyone had a great time (Obviously because it was a well-run event. Typist). You could have thrown a blanket over the first five TCC placings - Ron Masing in a 2.6 Lancer - 32.01; Andrew Grieve, 32.48; Trevor Parsonage, 32.52 (both in a Datsun 1600) Don Adams, 32.62 in a bog standard Audi Fox1600 and Brett Bower, 32.74 - he had driven his Datsun 1600 straight from competing in a state rally at Bathurst the night before. Jim Richardson was the only casualty of the day, nudging the bank at the start / finish line with his Hillman Imp. The Ford Galaxy mentioned in earlier 'Look Back' articles, was offered for sale at \$4000.

1993:

The Executive was re-elected almost intact except that we had no Social Secretary or committee. This function was taken over by the Executive Committee. RE-elected Editor, Ray Rowe, welcomed new

members to the various committees and gave us an excellent report on the Bathurst V8 race on the long weekend. As President, I also thanked those elected to office for their continued support and gave brief reports on past and coming events. We had a big month event wise, the first being a rally to Port Macquarie, to which we sent 6 teams in a field of 29 - the other 23 were all locals. First outright was Brett Bower and Ian Maher in the Corolla, with Craig Kenchington and Oliver Moog, 2nd in the T18 Toyota. The next day we had several TCC starters at the National Mororkhana Championship run by Mini CC. The event had over 100 starters including some from W.A. Steven Henry won the Junior Class and Les Payne took out the 4WD class. One unusual entry was that of Wendy Maher who drove a 'works' Civic built by Arthur Jackson and supplied by Wayne Griffiths. Needless to say, the car, built for 2E Racing, was too much for Wendy and she was beaten out of 1st Lady position. Next event was the first 'Targa Thornleigh' – a two day Touring Assembly and one of the first events of this now popular type of motor sport. The event was run by Wendy and myself and was won by Jo Anne and Peter Batt. The 23 crews stayed overnight at the Hampton Pub and had one of the beat parties in the history of TCC. There were lots of pages of reports written about this event – but really, you had to be there! We also had a good turn-out at an Amaroo Park Super Sprint run by HDCC, but once again, no results! Andrew Welsby celebrated his 30th birthday by taking out Australian Citizenship. Ernie Young sold (gave

away) his Datsun 1600 with all its good gear. It's not recorded who bought it, but I think it was Brett Bower. More next month,

We need all current Trainee officials to upgrade to General officials. This involves officiating for one day and filling out a Trainee form and then completing an online Introductory module. This can be completed in any order. By becoming a General official it will mean less work for the Event Secretary, but you will also receive a CAMS Officials Licence Book similar to your CAMS Competition Licence Book. Whenever you officiate, this book then gets signed by a member of the organising committee for that event.



It is of note that Bronze level official licences never expire. TCC really NEED MORE Bronze level Event Admin, Event Command and Scrutineer officials. We simply do not have enough of these in the club to allow members to only officiate in a higher role at one TCC event in a year allowing them to compete in other events.

Just to repeat that Bronze level official licences never expire. For members a little worried about learning and performing these roles, please be assured that we have many members in the club who are happy to mentor you through this process. Help is never far away. Some roles will require you to be actively involved in the organisation of the event so leaving this to the last minute will not benefit yourself with any potential assessments. TCC has plenty of events that you can help run and upgrade your licence, so please have a good think about it and speak to an Executive member in order to start the process.
